

Computing

We will focus on the computer science strand of computing. We will be learning about algorithms and using them to create and debug simple programs. We will understand that programs need precise instructions. We will also use our logical reasoning skills to predict what programs will do.

Year 1 will be designing programs to move the bluebots around a grid, and then using the ipads to control the bluebots.

Year 2 will be using Scratch Junior to design and debug programs.

We will be taking part in e-safety activities as part of E-Safety Day on 11th February. We will be exploring how to manage our identity online especially in relation to avatars.

We will be using the 'talk for writing approach' to learn the story and then write our own versions.

We will be studying everyday materials and their uses.

We will be learning about flammable and fireproof materials.

We will study how materials change when they are heated.

We will be taking part in the Big Bird Watch to survey the birds which visit our school grounds.

History

Children will learn about events beyond living memory that are significant nationally—the Great Fire of London.

They will identify similarities and differences between ways of life in different periods. They will use a wide vocabulary of everyday historical terms.

They will ask and answer questions, choosing and using parts of stories and other sources to show that they know and understand key features of events.

They will understand some of the ways in which we find out about the past.

We will start by using found objects, then potato prints to match the patterns and colours in Gustav Klimt's work The Portrait of Adele Bloch-Bauer.

We will be creating monoprints using plastic bags on the theme of the Fire of London.

We will also be creating prints using polystyrene tiles.

Finally, we will use ICT to make stamps to create prints..
